President, and CEO of the Heinz History Center. Andy gave an interesting presentation regarding history in our region, highlighting a young, unknown George Washington who journeyed through our area, then



known as "the Ohios". He also shared some history regarding the Lewis & Clark expedition, which began in Pittsburgh on the Ohio River after the completion of the 50' keelboat which had been built at Ft. Fayette. Andy then advised the planning of a new permanent exhibition at the History Center, highlighting the history of our rivers and those who worked there. Shane Checkan, Navigation Committee Chair presented the Navigation Report. Shane advised the importance of having lines ready to lock your tow. More than 5 cuts will require an assist boat. Assist boats must be prearranged within 6 hours of locking to allow your assist is present and ready to work with no delay. Planning is vital to keep delays during on-going construction at many of the locks to a minimum. An Assist Boat can be exchanged without penalty of "timed out" crew.
